On November 15-16, more than 100 high school students will arrive on the Virginia Tech campus in Blacksburg for our inaugural Virginia Tech Honor String Orchestra Festival! During the festival, students will rehearse with nationally and internationally renowned clinicians and educators, participate in instrumental master classes with Virginia Tech music faculty, and socialize with like-minded students. We culminate the festival experience with a combined concert together with the Virginia Tech Philharmonic on Saturday, November 16, in our world-class Moss Arts Center (artscenter.vt.edu)!

Students must be able to fulfill the following requirements if they are accepted:

- The festival begins with registration on Friday, November 15, at (9:30am) and ends on Saturday, November 16, after the evening concert. Students must be present for the entire event and accompanied by a parent, guardian, or director for the weekend when not involved with the honor band festivities.
- The cost for each student is \$95. Talk to your orchestra director about how your school handles this; each <u>orchestra program</u> will pay for all its students with one check. This fee will cover all activities for the festival, including:
 - o An honor orchestra t-shirt
 - o Group masterclass with a Virginia Tech professor on your instrument
 - o A student social event on Friday night with pizza, bowling, and games
- Chair Placement: based on the Director's recommendation.
- Your orchestra director is nominating you because they think you represent your orchestra program well. We look at all the nominations and accept students based on entries turned in to create balanced instrumentation. Acceptance results will be emailed to directors on October 1st. It is an honor to be nominated so thank your director for thinking of you.
 Refunds will not be issued after that date and no student substitutions are allowed.
- Be sure to bring your instrument and all supplies.
- All rehearsals are held on VT's campus in Blacksburg and students must attend all rehearsals, which start at 1:00 PM on Friday and run through Saturday. We will not excuse anyone for extracurricular activities.
