Suffolk Public Schools Field Trip Learning Objective Lakeland High School AFJROTC Field Trip to New York April 24 - April 27, 2025

- 6. **Cultural Appreciation and Awareness**: Visiting iconic locations such as Times Square, the Empire State Building, and Madison Square Garden will also expose cadets to New York's rich cultural heritage and diversity, furthering their understanding of American identity in a global context.

A. Situation:

Cadets will travel to Manhattan, New York, to visit significant historical and cultural sites foundational to the United States. The trip will begin with classroom assignments on various locations, followed by on-site visits. Historical sites to be visited include the United Nations, Ellis Island, the Statue of Liberty, Battery Park, Harlem Tour (Malcolm X Street, Apollo Theater, Wax Museum), Ground Zero Memorial, Times Square (Good Morning America), the Empire State Building, African American Museum, Federal Reserve, Wall Street, Madison Square Garden, Penn Station, World Trade Center, and others.

B. Environmental Considerations

- **Weather and Light Data:** Forecast for New York includes mainly cloudy skies with temperatures around 60 degrees Fahrenheit. High of 60°F, low of 44°F. Cadets will wear jackets in the morning and transition to short sleeves as temperatures rise.
- **Terrain and Population:** Manhattan is highly urbanized with dense populations, road networks, and restricted zones. The area provides ample

- cover through buildings. Obstacles include heavy traffic, barriers, and crowded streets, which may hinder movement.
- **Interaction with the Public:** The general population will be present at visited sites. Cadets must maneuver carefully and adhere to public conduct standards. Most interactions are expected to be neutral or positive.

C. Mission

Manor High School JROTC Battalion and Lakeland High School JROTC will travel from Portsmouth, Virginia, to Manhattan, New York, on April 23, 2025, departing no later than 1:00 AM on April 24, 2025. The purpose is to provide cadets with firsthand knowledge of the U.S. Government's historical foundations and the role of international governance through the United Nations.

D. Execution

• Intent:

- Educate cadets on U.S. and international governance.
- Develop an appreciation for citizenship rights under the U.S. Constitution.
- Ensure completion of academic assignments related to the trip.

• Phases of Operation:

- Phase 1 (Planning & Preparation): Staff finalizes logistics. Cadets arrive for pre-trip inspection at Manor High School no later than 11:00 PM on April 23, 2025.
- **Phase 2 (Travel & Arrival):** Depart via charter bus from Manor High School. Check in at Hilton Garden Inn.
- Phase 3 (Site Visits & Tours):
 - **April 24:** United Nations tour, African American Museum, Empire State Building, Madison Square Garden, Times Square.
 - **April 25:** Good Morning America, Battery Park, Statue of Liberty, Ellis Island, Ground Zero, Rockefeller Plaza, Wall Street financial district.
 - **April 26:** African American Museum, Harlem Tour, Apollo Theater.
- **Phase 4 (Return & Reflection):** Cadets return to Manor High School. Reflection reports due by May 15, 2025.

Responsibilities & Conduct:

- Cadets must adhere to the packing list and dress code (business attire, no jeans, hoodies, excessive jewelry, or facial hair).
- Cameras, electronic devices, and personal items are allowed at the cadet's risk.
- Cadet leadership is responsible for group conduct.
- Chaperones hold the same authority as instructors.
- Violations of local laws will be subject to local law enforcement.

E. Logistics & Support

• **Cost:** \$200 per cadet, cadre, and chaperone due by April 1, 2025. Covers transportation and lodging. Breakfast included; cadets must provide their own lunch and dinner.

Medical & Safety:

- Cadets must report all medical incidents to cadre.
- First-aid kits will be available.
- All cadets are responsible for safety and accountability within their assigned groups.

By following these guidelines, the trip will provide cadets with an enriching educational experience in a structured and disciplined environment.
